**CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH****Part One—The Profession of Faith**

"I BELIEVE" – "WE BELIEVE"

**1. What is the plan of God for man?**

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent his Son as the Redeemer and Saviour of mankind, fallen into sin, thus calling all into his Church and, through the work of the Holy Spirit, making them adopted children and heirs of his eternal happiness.

**MAN'S CAPACITY FOR GOD**

*"You are great, O Lord, and greatly to be praised [...]*

*You have made us for yourself and our heart is restless until it rests in you."* (Saint Augustine)

**2. Why does man have a desire for God?**

God himself, in creating man in his own image, has written upon his heart the desire to see him. Even if this desire is often ignored, God never ceases to draw man to himself because only in God will he find and live the fullness of truth and happiness for which he never stops searching. By nature and by vocation, therefore, man is a religious being, capable of entering into communion with God. This intimate and vital bond with God confers on man his fundamental dignity.

**3. How is it possible to know God with only the light of human reason?**

Starting from creation, that is from the world and from the human person, through reason alone one can know God with certainty as the origin and end of the universe, as the highest good and as infinite truth and beauty.

**4. Is the light of reason alone sufficient to know the mystery of God?**

In coming to a knowledge of God by the light of reason alone man experiences many difficulties. Indeed, on his own he is unable to enter into the intimacy of the divine mystery. This is why he stands in need of being enlightened by God's revelation, not only about those things that exceed his understanding, but also about those religious and moral truths which of themselves are not beyond the grasp of human reason, so that even in the present condition of the human race, they can be known by all with ease, with firm certainty and with no admixture of error.

**5. How can we speak about God?**

By taking as our starting point the perfections of man and of the other creatures which are a reflection, albeit a limited one, of the infinite perfection of God, we are able to speak about God with all people. We must, however, continually purify our language insofar as it is image-bound and imperfect, realizing that we can never fully express the infinite mystery of God.

**FEASTS OF THE WEEK****Memorial—THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (ALL SOULS)—Date:**

**Thursday, November 2:** The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased retained such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of prayer for the departed members.

In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on Nov 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church.

The feast acknowledges human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification is necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and states the prayers of the living can speed the process of purification.

...Observances of a more religious nature have survived. These include public processions or private visits to cemeteries and decorating graves with flowers and lights. This feast is observed with great fervor in Mexico.

*Reflection:* Whether or not one should pray for the dead is one of the great arguments which divide Christians. Appalled by the abuse of indulgences in the Church of his day, Martin Luther rejected the concept of purgatory. Yet prayer for a loved one is, for the believer, a way of erasing any distance, even death. In prayer we stand in God's presence in the company of someone we love, even if that person has gone before us into death.

We are both diagnosed with Spinal Muscular Atrophy type 2 (SMA II) and we are both on power wheelchairs at all times. The reason that I created this page is because my family needs an accessible vehicle. It would be very difficult for my family to pay for this vehicle because of physical disability and none of my family members work. This vehicle can help us by getting easily to our medical appointments without having to wait for a long period of time for the Wheel-Trans to show up. The vehicle would easily accommodate our wheel chairs and we won't have to worry about Wheel-Trans not showing up or arriving late for our appointments. There are lots of activities outside of school that we would like to do as a family such as going to swimming, playing hockey, volunteering in the community, etc. We have received funding from four charities (\$40,000) but it is not enough to cover the whole cost of the vehicle (van has to be converted—costs over \$70,000). I would really appreciate your help and any donation would help.

Jesus



**This Sunday's Readings:** *Exodus 22:20-26; Psalm 18:2-4, 47, 51; 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10; Matthew 22:34-40*

Jesus came not to abolish the Old Testament law but to fulfill it (see Matthew 5:17)

And in today's Gospel, He reveals that love – of God and of neighbour – is the fulfillment of the whole of the law (see Romans 13:8-10).

Devout Israelites were to keep all 613 commands found in the Bible's first five books. Jesus says today that all these, and all the teachings of the prophets, can be summarized by two verses of this law (see Deuteronomy 6:5; Leviticus 19:18).

He seems to summarize the two stone tablets on which God was said to have engraved the ten commandments (see Exodus 32:15-16). The first tablet set out three laws concerning the love of God – such as the command not to take His name in vain; the second contained seven commands regarding love of neighbour, such as those against stealing and adultery.

Love is the hinge that binds the two tablets of the law. For we can't love God, whom we can't see, if we don't love our neighbour, whom we can (see 1 John 4:20-22).

But this love we are called to is far more than simple affection or warm sentiment. We must give ourselves totally to God – loving with our whole beings, with all our heart, soul and mind. Our love for our neighbour must express itself in concrete actions, such as those set out in today's First Reading.

We love because He first loved us (see 1 John 4:19). As we sing in today's Psalm, He has been our deliverer, our strength when we could not possibly defend ourselves against the enemies of sin and death.

We love in thanksgiving for our salvation. And in this become imitators of Jesus, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle – laying down our lives daily in ways large and small, seen and unseen; our lives offered as a continual sacrifice of praise (see John 15:12-13; Hebrews 13:15).

## TRICK OR TREAT IS HARMLESS FUN

**Question**

Is it against Catholic teaching to pass out candy to children on Halloween night?

**Answer**

The Church has placed no restrictions on the celebration of Halloween. Contrary to what many people think, All Hollow's Eve (Halloween) is not an evil, pagan festival. It's actually a centuries-old Christian feast celebrated on the evening preceding All Saints Day (November 1) in commemoration of all the saints in heaven, known and unknown. In preparation for the evening vigil, people would fast and pray and celebrate Christ's victory over death.

Although the secularized version of Halloween has lost the focus on the true meaning of this feast, activities such as passing out candy, dressing up in costumes, carving pumpkins, and all the other accoutrements of Halloween should not be viewed as evil. You are free to take part in Halloween festivities or not. But if you do, it's good to keep in mind that the Church calls us to act as witnesses of the gospel and to guard against committing any offences against truth.

*The duty of Christians to take part in the life of the Church impels them to act as witnesses of the Gospel and of the obligations that flow from it. This witness is a transmission of the faith in words and deeds (Catechism 2472).*
