## CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

### Part One—The Profession of Faith

*"Jesus Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and was born of the Virgin Mary"*

#### 109. In the Kingdom, what authority did Jesus bestow upon his Apostles?

Jesus chose the twelve, the future witnesses of his Resurrection, and made them sharers of his mission and of his authority to teach, to absolve from sins, and to build up and govern the Church. In this college, Peter received "the keys of the Kingdom" (Mt16:19) and assumed the first place with the mission to keep the faith in its integrity and to strengthen his brothers.

#### 110. What is the meaning of the Transfiguration?

Above all the Transfiguration shows forth the Trinity: "the Father in the voice, the Son in the man Jesus, the Spirit in the shining cloud" (Saint Thomas Aquinas). Speaking with Moses and Elijah about his "departure" (Lk9:31), Jesus reveals that his glory comes by way of the cross and he anticipates his resurrection and his glorious coming "which will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body" (Phil3:21).

*"You were transfigured on the mountain and your disciples, as much as they were capable of it, beheld your glory, O Christ our God, so that when they should see you crucified they would understand that your passion was voluntary, and proclaim to the world that you truly are the splendour of the Father." (Byzantine Liturgy)*

#### 111. How did the messianic entrance into Jerusalem come about?

At the established time Jesus chose to go up to Jerusalem to suffer his passion and death, and to rise from the dead. As the Messiah King who shows forth the coming of the Kingdom, he entered into his city mounted on a donkey. He was acclaimed by the little children whose shout of joyful praise is taken up in the Sanctus of the Eucharistic liturgy: "Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna (save us!)" (Mt21:9). The liturgy of the Church opens Holy Week by celebrating this entry into Jerusalem.

### DEAR PARENTS

*We have four (4) young Missionaries coming to our parish from the Archdiocese of Toronto this summer for one week: Sunday, July 8—Saturday, July 14.*

They will run a day program and evening program. The program name is "Totus Tuus" (Totally Yours) and is inspired by St John Paul II's words to youth, "Give yourself totally to God".

**(Registration Fee: \$10 per Student)**

The Day program commences on Monday to Saturday of this week from 8:45AM to 2:30PM daily

During the week, the children entering grades one through six in the upcoming fall school year participate in four classes each day, attend daily Mass, learn the Mass parts and liturgical songs, participate in games, icebreakers, skits, songs, recess, and prayer. The grade school curriculum helps children to learn and be reinforced in important principles of their Catholic faith. Furthermore, Totus Tuus strives to help students be clear and consistent in their faith. College students who are on fire with their faith give the students examples which the youth can observe and then imitate. This process teaches them that being a witness to their faith in the world around them is a very realistic and worthwhile goal. Finally, Totus Tuus endeavours to show children that the humble, yet courageous process of seeking Christ is a journey that must be aided by prayer and the Sacraments.

The evening program commences at 6:45PM to 9PM daily: Sunday to Friday of this week.

Totus Tuus offers evening instruction for junior and senior high school youth (grades 7-12) during the week in the evenings: 7pm—9pm. We have found that energetic, faithful, college-aged teachers can effectively impact junior and senior high school youth. The Program includes instruction, small group discussions, quiet meditation, prayer, and fellowship. The team teaches in such a way as to continually offer a dialogue by which participants feel respected in their most basic dignity.

## "This Is My Son, The Beloved; Listen To Him!"

The Father



**This Sunday's Readings:** *Gn 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18; Ps 116:10, 15-19; Rom 8:31-34; Mk 9:2-10*

The Lenten season continues with another story of testing. Last Sunday, we heard the trial of Jesus in the desert. In this week's First Reading, we hear of how Abraham was put to the test.

The Church has always read this story as a sign of God's love for the world in giving His only begotten son.

In today's Epistle, Paul uses exact words drawn from this story to describe how God, like Abraham, did not withhold His only Son, but handed Him over for us on the Cross (see Romans 8:32; Genesis 22:12,16).

In the Gospel today, too, we hear another echo. Jesus is called God's "beloved Son"—as Isaac is described as Abraham's beloved firstborn son.

These readings are given to us in Lent to reveal Christ's identity and to strengthen us in the face of our afflictions.

Jesus is shown to be the true son that Abraham rejoiced to see (see Matthew 1:1; John 8:56). In His transfiguration, He is revealed to be the "prophet like

Moses" foretold by God—raised from among their own kinsmen, speaking with God's own authority (see Deuteronomy 18:15, 19).

Like Moses, He climbs the mountain with three named friends and beholds God's glory in a cloud (see Exodus 24:1, 9, 15). He is the one prophesied to come after Elijah's return (see Sirach 48:9-10; Malachi 3:1, 23-24).

And, as He discloses to the apostles, He is the Son of Man sent to suffer and die for our sins (see Isaiah 53:3).

As we sing in today's Psalm, Jesus believed in the face of His afflictions, and God loosed Him from the bonds of death (see Psalm 116:3).

His rising should give us the courage to face our trials, to offer ourselves totally to the Father—as He did, as Abraham and Isaac did.

Freed from death by His death, we come to this Mass to offer the sacrifice of thanksgiving, and to renew our vows—as His servants and faithful ones.

### HOW DOES THE EUCHARIST LINK TO OUR RESURRECTION?

#### Question

What does Jesus mean when he says we must eat and drink his body and blood to be raised on the last day?

#### Answer

What Our Lord means is that, in order to reach eternal life, each person must be linked to his death and resurrection through an active faith and love. We would say in traditional language that the fruits of his Passion must be applied to souls individually.

The means Our Lord established in order to apply these fruits to individual souls are the sacraments, which are saving signs that link us to Christ's death, and the present grace he gives, and the reward of eternal life.

The greatest and most powerful of the sacraments is the Eucharist. This sacrament is thus the paradigm of salvation here below, and so Our Lord relates eternal salvation in the resurrection to our eating and drinking his body and blood by our faith and love for him in this holy sacrament of sacraments.

Even if you are unable to receive him physically in the sacrament, you still eat and drink him spiritually by believing in his presence and by loving him. Thus, St. Thomas teaches that even little children who are as yet unable to receive the Eucharist nonetheless eat and drink of Christ by their faith and love for him in the holy sacrament.

## LENT IS HERE!!!

**When Is Ash Wednesday?—February 14**

### **What is Ash Wednesday?**

This day marks the beginning of Lent. We attend Mass on this day and receive the Ashes on the forehead as a sign of sorrow for sin and as sign of our intention to become more faithful.

### **What is Lent?**

The penitential season of the Church's year. It is 40 days of preparation to renew our Baptismal vows on Easter Sunday. During this time we seek closer union with the Lord through an increase of *fasting*, *prayer*, and *giving of alms* (charitable giving).

### **Lenten Fast & Abstinence**

Catholics are obligated to Fast & Abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

### **The Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**

The fast on Ash Wed and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. No eating between meals.

### **Abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**

Abstinence on these days from meat can include eggs or dairy products.

### **Age Requirements**

"All Catholics at 15 are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60 year.

### **Fridays of the Year**

It is a requirement of our Faith that we abstain from meat on all the Fridays of the year (except Feasts) in commemoration of our Saviour's death.
