CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Part One—The Profession of Faith

"Jesus Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and was born of the Virgin Mary"

116. Did Jesus contradict Israel's faith in the one God and saviour?

Jesus never contradicted faith in the one God, not even when he performed the stupendous divine work which fulfilled the messianic promises and revealed himself as equal to God, namely the pardoning of sins. However, the call of Jesus to believe in him and to be converted makes it possible to understand the tragic misunderstanding of the Sanhedrin which judged Jesus to be worthy of death as a blasphemer.

117. Who is responsible for the death of Jesus?

The passion and death of Jesus cannot be imputed indiscriminately either to all the Jews that were living at that time or to their descendants. Every single sinner, that is, every human being is really the cause and the instrument of the sufferings of the Redeemer; and the greater blame in this respect falls on those above all who are Christians and who the more often fall into sin or delight in their vices.

118. Why was the death of Jesus part of God's plan?

To reconcile to himself all who were destined to die because of sin God took the loving initiative of sending his Son that he might give himself up for sinners. Proclaimed in the Old Testament, especially as the sacrifice of the Suffering Servant, the death of Jesus came about "in accordance with the Scriptures".

119. In what way did Christ offer himself to the Father?

The entire life of Christ was a free offering to the Father to carry out his plan of salvation. He gave "his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45) and in this way he reconciled all of humanity with God. His suffering and death showed how his humanity was the free and perfect instrument of that divine love which desires the salvation of all people.

120. How is Jesus' offering expressed at the Last Supper?

At the Last Supper with his apostles on the eve of his passion Jesus anticipated, that is, both symbolized his free self-offering and made it really present: "This is my Body which is given for you" (Lk22:19), "This is my

Blood which is poured out..." (Mt26:28) Thus he both instituted the Eucharist as the "memorial" (1 Cor 11:25) of his sacrifice and instituted his apostles as priests of the new covenant.

SAINT'S FEAST DAY

Optional Memorial: St Patrick, Bishop—Sat, March 17: Patrick he was humble and he was courageous. The determination to accept suffering and success with equal indifference guided the life of God's instrument for winning most of Ireland for Christ.

At 16, he and a large number of his father's slaves and vassals were captured by Irish raiders and sold as slaves in Ireland. Forced to work as a shepherd, he suffered greatly from hunger and cold.

After six years Patrick escaped, probably to France, and later returned to Britain at the age of 22. His captivity had meant spiritual conversion. He spent years in France, and was consecrated bishop at the age of 43. His great desire was to proclaim the good news to the Irish.

In a dream vision it seemed "all the children of Ireland from their mothers' wombs were stretching out their hands" to him. He understood the vision to be a call to do mission work in pagan Ireland. He was sent to carry out the task. He went to the west and north—where the faith had never been preached—obtained the protection of local kings, and made numerous converts.

Because of the island's pagan background, Patrick was emphatic in encouraging widows to remain chaste and young women to consecrate their virginity to Christ. He ordained many priests, divided the country into dioceses, held Church councils, monasteries and continually urged his people to greater holiness in Christ.

He suffered much opposition from pagan druids. In a relatively short time, the island had experienced deeply the Christian spirit, and was prepared to send out missionaries whose efforts were greatly responsible for re-Christianizing Europe.

Patrick was a man of action, with little inclination toward learning. He had a rock-like belief in his vocation, in the cause he had espoused. One of the few certainly authentic writings is his Confessio, above all an act of homage to God for having called Patrick, unworthy sinner, to the apostolate.

Reflection: What distinguishes Patrick is the durability of his efforts. When one considers the state of Ireland when he began his mission work, the vast extent of his labours, and how the seeds he planted continued to grow and flourish, one can only admire the kind of man Patrick must have been. The holiness of a person is known only by the fruits of his or her work.

DEAR PARENTS

We have four (4) young Missionaries coming to our parish from the Archdiocese of Toronto this summer for one week: Sunday, July 8—Saturday, July 14.

They will run a day program and evening program. The program name is "Totus Tuus" (Totally Yours) and is inspired by St John Paul II's words to youth, "Give yourself totally to God".

(Registration Fee: \$10 per Student)

The Day program commences on Monday to Saturday of this week from 8:45AM to 2:30PM daily

During the week, the children entering grades one through six in the upcoming fall school year participate in four classes each day, attend daily Mass, learn the Mass parts and liturgical songs, participate in games, icebreakers, skits, songs, recess, and prayer. The grade school curriculum helps children to learn and be reinforced in important principles of their Catholic faith. Furthermore, Totus Tuus strives to help students be clear and consistent in their faith. College students who are on fire with their faith give the students examples which the youth can observe and then imitate. This process teaches them that being a witness to their faith in the world around them is a very realistic and worthwhile goal. Finally, Totus Tuus endeavours to show children that the humble, yet courageous process of seeking Christ is a journey that must be aided by prayer and the Sacraments.

The evening program commences at 6:45PM to 9PM daily: Sunday to Friday of this week.

Totus Tuus offers evening instruction for junior and senior high school youth (grades 7-12) during the week in the evenings: 7pm—9pm. We have found that energetic, faithful, college-aged teachers can effectively impact junior and senior high school youth. The Program includes instruction, small group discussions, quiet meditation, prayer, and fellowship. The team teaches in such a way as to continually offer a dialogue by which participants feel respected in their most basic dignity.

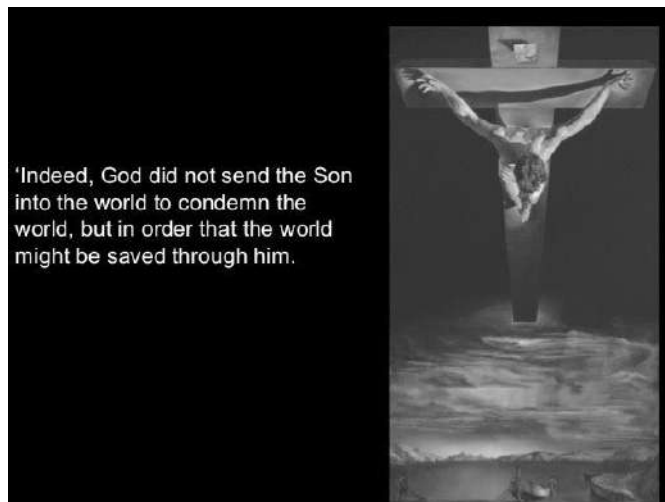

**"God Did Not Send The Son Into The World To Condemn The World,
But In Order That The World Might Be Saved Through Him"**

JESUS



This Sunday's Readings: *2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23; Ps 137:1-6; Eph 2:4-10; Jn 3:14-21*

The Sunday readings in Lent have been showing us the high points of salvation history—God's covenant with creation in the time of Noah; His promises to Abraham; the law He gave to Israel at Sinai.

In today's First Reading, we hear of the destruction of the kingdom established by God's final Old Testament covenant—the covenant with David (see *2 Samuel 7*; *Psalm 89:3*).

His chosen people abandoned the law He gave them. For their sins, the temple was destroyed, and they were exiled in Babylon. We hear their sorrow and repentance in the exile lament we sing as today's Psalm.

But we also hear how God, in His mercy, gathered them back, even anointing a pagan king to shepherd them and rebuild the temple (see *Isaiah 44:28-45:1,4*).

God is rich in mercy, as today's Epistle teaches. He promised that David's kingdom would last forever, that David's son would be His Son and rule all nations (see *2 Samuel 7:14-15*; *Psalm 2:7-9*). In Jesus, God keeps that promise (see *Revelation 22:16*).

Moses lifted up the serpent as a sign of salvation (see *Wisdom 16:6-7*; *Numbers 21:9*). Now Jesus is lifted up on the Cross, to draw all people to himself (see *John 12:32*).

Those who refuse to believe in this sign of the Father's love condemn themselves—as the Israelites in their infidelity brought judgment upon themselves.

But God did not leave Israel in exile, and He does not want to leave any of us dead in our transgressions. We are God's handiwork, saved to live as His people in the light of His truth.

Midway through this season of repentance, let us again behold the Pierced One (see *John 19:37*), and rededicate ourselves to living the "good works" that God has prepared us for.

DOES THE HOLY SPIRIT DWELL IN NON-CHRISTIANS?

Question

If the Holy Spirit only dwells in a baptized person, does it mean that non-baptized people do not have Holy Spirit in them?

Answer

The indwelling of the Holy Trinity, including the Holy Spirit, is a gift of baptism (CCC 1265-66; see 1996-2000; 2014; 2021). Christians who remain in a state of sanctifying or habitual grace are blessed by this most holy indwelling (CCC 2000).

Those who are not Christians and thus not baptized do not have the indwelling of the Holy Trinity. However, one should not erroneously conclude that God is unconcerned about them or even has abandoned them. Indeed, all human persons are made in God's image and likeness (Gen. 1:26-27), and God seeks to aid them on Earth through actual graces (CCC 2000; 2024). And God is certainly desirous of their eternal salvation, which is why, in part, he gives his Catholic Church the Great Commission to make disciples of all nations (Matt. 28:18-20).

IS CONSULTING A PSYCHIC A GRAVE SIN?

Question

is going to a psychic a mortal sin if you didn't realize it was?

Answer

Consulting a psychic or other medium is undoubtedly grave matter and thus certainly to be avoided (CCC 2116; see also 2115-17). Grave matter is one of three components of a mortal sin. The other two are full knowledge and complete consent (see CCC 1854-64).

We cannot evaluate your subjective culpability in this matter from afar, but your self-reporting sounds like there could be mitigating circumstances. In any event, seek a faithful Catholic priest in confession so that through the ministry given to him by Jesus Christ he can absolve you of this sin (see John 20:21-23). And then go and strive diligently with God's help to avoid this sin.

LENT IS HERE!!!

When Is Ash Wednesday?—February 14

What is Ash Wednesday?

This day marks the beginning of Lent. We attend Mass on this day and receive the Ashes on the forehead as a sign of sorrow for sin and as sign of our intention to become more faithful.

What is Lent?

The penitential season of the Church's year. It is 40 days of preparation to renew our Baptismal vows on Easter Sunday. During this time we seek closer union with the Lord through an increase of *fasting*, *prayer*, and *giving of alms* (charitable giving).

Lenten Fast & Abstinence

Catholics are obligated to Fast & Abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

The Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

The fast on Ash Wed and Good Friday involves eating only one full meal. One or two smaller meals may be taken on those days, but may not total one full meal. No eating between meals.

Abstinence on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Abstinence on these days from meat can include eggs or dairy products.

Age Requirements

"All Catholics at 15 are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60 year.

Fridays of the Year

It is a requirement of our Faith that we abstain from meat on all the Fridays of the year (except Feasts) in commemoration of our Saviour's death.
