THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

"I believe" – "We believe"

THE TRANSMISSION OF DIVINE REVELATION

11. Why and in what way is divine revelation transmitted?

God "desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4), that is, of Jesus Christ. For this reason, Christ must be proclaimed to all according to his own command, "Go forth and teach all nations" (Matthew 28:19). And this is brought about by Apostolic Tradition.

12. What is Apostolic Tradition?

Apostolic Tradition is the transmission of the message of Christ, brought about from the very beginnings of Christianity by means of preaching, bearing witness, institutions, worship, and inspired writings. The apostles transmitted all they received from Christ and learned from the Holy Spirit to their successors, the bishops, and through them to all generations until the end of the world.

13. In what ways does Apostolic Tradition occur?

Apostolic Tradition occurs in two ways: through the living transmission of the word of God (also simply called Tradition) and through Sacred Scripture which is the same proclamation of salvation in written form.

14. What is the relationship between Tradition and Sacred Scripture?

Tradition and Sacred Scripture are bound closely together and communicate one with the other. Each of them makes present and fruitful in the Church the mystery of Christ. They flow out of the same divine well-spring and together make up one sacred deposit of faith from which the Church derives her certainty about revelation.

15. To whom is the deposit of faith entrusted?

The Apostles entrusted the deposit of faith to the whole of the Church. Thanks to its supernatural sense of faith the people of God as a whole, assisted by the Holy Spirit and guided by the Magisterium of the Church, never ceases to welcome, to penetrate more deeply and to live more fully from the gift of divine revelation.

16. To whom is given the task of authentically interpreting the deposit of faith?

The task of giving an authentic interpretation of the deposit of faith has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone, that is, to the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome, and to the bishops in communion with him. To this Magisterium, which in the service of the Word of God enjoys the certain charism of truth, belongs also the task of defining dogmas which are formulations of the truths contained in divine Revelation.

This authority of the Magisterium also extends to those truths necessarily connected with Revelation.

17. What is the relationship between Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium?

Scripture, Tradition, and the Magisterium are so closely united with each other that one of them cannot stand without the others. Working together, each in its own way, under the action of the one Holy Spirit, they all contribute effectively to the salvation of souls.

Our Archbishop, his Eminence, Cardinal Collins, has designated the Feast of St Michael, the Archangel, to be celebrated this year as a Solemnity THIS Sunday, September 29. St Michael, the Archangel is the patron of the Archdiocese of Toronto. His Feast falls on September 29 every year. This year it falls on a Sunday but is not normally celebrated as the Sunday, the Lord's Day, takes precedence over a saint's day. However because he is the patron saint of the archdiocese we will observe his feast as a Solemnity. Due to this celebration, the normal Sunday readings will not be used, the readings for St Michael's feast will be used.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

St PADRE PIO OF PIETRELCINA, PRIEST—

Memorial: Mon, Sep 23: Pope JPll canonized Padre Pio of Pietrelcina on June 16, 2002. The Holy Father praise the new saint for his prayer and charity. He also stressed Padre Pio's witness to the power of suffering. If accepted with love, the Holy Father stressed, such suffering can lead to "a privileged path of sanctity." On September 20, 1918, as he was making his thanksgiving after Mass, Padre Pio had a vision of Jesus. When the vision ended, he had the stigmata in his hands, feet, and side. Padre Pio rarely left the friary after he received the stigmata, but busloads of people soon began coming to see him. In time his confessional ministry would take 10 hours a day. Many of them have said that Padre Pio knew details of their lives that they had never mentioned. Padre Pio saw Jesus in all the sick and suffering. At his urging, a fine hospital was built on nearby Mount Gargano.

St JEAN DE BREBEUF & ST ISAAC JOGUES, PRIESTS, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS, SECONDARY PATRONS OF CANADA—Feast:

Thursday, September 26: This day honours the eight martyrs of North America – six Jesuit priests and two lay assistants – who died between 1642 and 1649. All came from Europe in response to a call for "missionaries to the Indians", and all showed great courage. The first group, who died in the United States, included Isaac Jogues and the laymen Rene Goupil and Jean de la Lande. The second group, who died in Canada, included Jean de Brebeuf, Antoine Daniel, Gabriel Lalement, Charles Garnier, and Noel Chabanel. These men were aware of the dangers involved and of the fate of captives. Some of them were captured and escaped, but returned, persisting in their efforts to preach the Gospel to the Indigenous peoples. Accounts of the martyrdom of Brebeuf and Lalemant survive today in the Jesuit Relations. At Auriesville, NY, and at Midland, ON, the shrines erected to the memory of the martyrs attract thousands of pilgrims annually.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL, PRIEST—Memorial: Thursday,

September 26: St Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. Most remarkable, Vincent was by temperament a very irascible person—even his friends admitted it. He said that except for the grace of God he would have been "hard and repulsive, rough and cross." But he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others. Pope Leo XIII made him the patron of all charitable societies. Outstanding among these, of course, is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by his admirer Blessed Frédéric Ozanam.

ST LAWRENCE RUIZ & COMPANIONS, MARTYRS

—Optional Memorial: Thursday, September 26: Lorenzo

Ruiz was born in Binondo, Manila, grew in faith, nurtured by his Chinese father and Filipino mother. He served as a sacristan at a local convent and later developed his skill as a calligrapher, transcribing sacramental documents for the Binondo Dominican parish. He married and had three children, two boys and a girl. Suddenly, the life of this trustworthy religious man changed dramatically. Falsely accused of murder in 1636, Lorenzo escaped with the help of Dominican missionaries. They boarded a ship headed for Japan during a time of persecution of Christians. Shortly after their arrival in Okinawa, they were all captured, taken to Nagasaki, and tortured for their beliefs. Rather than deny his faith, San Lorenzo Ruiz suffered a gruelling martyrdom.

"I am a Catholic and I will remain a Catholic even to the point of death. Only to God will I offer my life. Even if I had a thousand lives, I will still offer them to Him."

Dear Friends,

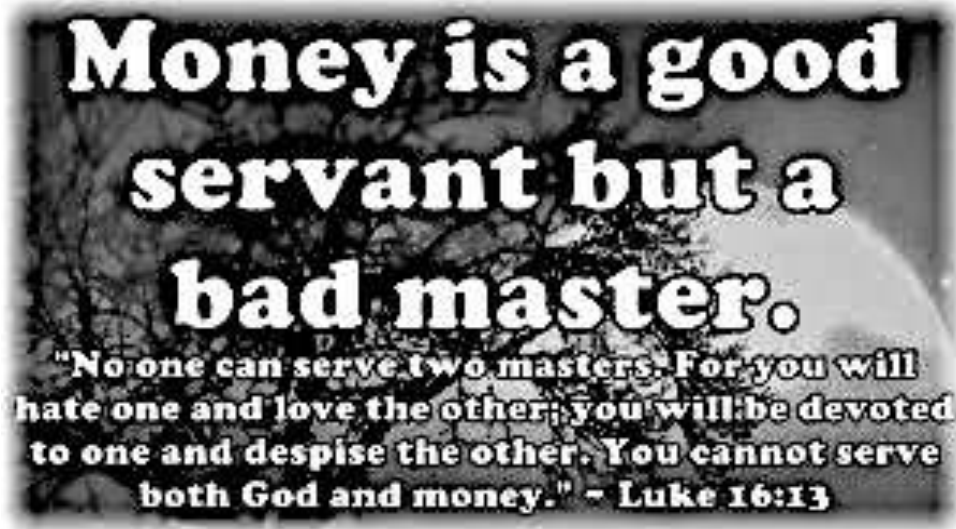

In this way, we will all have the opportunity to contribute to towards helping this family suffering and expelled from their homeland because of their faith in Christ.

I will be contributing to this fund myself so that we are all doing our bit. *The first monthly second collection will be Sun, Sep 29.* Unfortunately, we will have to suspend our Chalice Children's collection for the foreseeable future as this Refugee Collection clashes with it.

Serving the Greater Master

From a young age, society presents us the “perfect” roadmap for a life of happiness. This vision usually includes having the fancy job, a large house, extravagant clothes and a large sum of money in the bank. It is engrained in our upbringing that the amassing of wealth should be the most important facet of our life, which is why the Lord’s words in today’s Gospel, that “you cannot serve God and wealth,” can be so difficult to swallow.

It is interesting that Jesus doesn’t say we cannot have wealth, but instead, that we should not serve wealth. What does it mean to serve wealth? It is to preferentially prioritize our efforts for career advancement over our efforts

to deepen our relationship with God. Essentially, those who serve wealth utilize all of their time and talents to attain more and more possessions. Stewards on the other hand utilize their time and talents to serve Christ and His Church.

In order to foster a healthy attitude towards our wealth, it is important to view it, and our very lives themselves, as a gift from God. It is only then that we can begin to move from gratitude to generosity, graciously sharing our gifts with others for the glory of God and the church. When the temptation to hold onto our wealth looms over us, let us remember Christ’s words, and ask ourselves how are we sharing our gifts with the parish community?

LOSING FAITH IN GOD?

Question: My brother has told me he doesn't believe in God anymore. I know he hasn't told our parents, and he's still going to Mass and Communion with us. What should I do?

Answer: First of all, it shows that you love your brother quite a bit to be concerned about this. That's a good thing. Keep that love for him strong. Sincere love can often do far more than any words.

Interestingly, going through a faze like this while growing up could actually be a sign of a good thing. Sure, it's never good to lose faith in God. But I wonder if something deeper isn't happening. What I mean is that, in some ways, this is a very normal part of growing up. As a child we are taught to believe in God and usually we do. We have the simple and authentic faith of a child. As we grow and mature that faith must also grow and mature and we must choose to believe on a deeper and more personal level. In other words, we must believe because we really do believe. The problem is that sometimes things get in the way of that process.

For example, something heard on TV or perhaps even said in the classroom may have had the effect of confusing your brother about some aspect of his faith. Though it's not good to be confused, often the "confusion" one goes through is a result of trying to figure things out and understand. I think that this process of "doubting" is often more of a time a "questioning." Perhaps your brother told you he no longer believes because he was looking for you to help him to believe. Perhaps it was even his way of asking for help in sorting things out.

If that's the case then I suggest one of the best approaches for you to take is this. Wait for your brother to say something about this again and when he does simply smile and gently ask him to tell you more. And then just listen. Listen to what made him think this way. Let him explain it. Let him talk about it. Regardless of what he says I would encourage you to spend most of the time listening and trying to understand. If he makes some good points and you have a good answer then go ahead and offer that answer if he will listen. If, on the other hand, you're not sure how to respond then simply tell him that. And then spend some time thinking, praying, studying and asking god for the right answer. If you need to you could even go ask your priest. Once you feel like you have a good answer look for another opportunity to share that with him. He may be impressed that you took his concern seriously and tried to come up with a good answer.

As for his continuing to go to Mass and Communion, it's true that we should not go to Communion if we do not believe. But I'd leave that to your brother and God for now. Your brother may actually believe more than he has let on. And going to Mass may be one of the best things he can do during this time of struggle. But in the end, if you feel quite burdened by this it may be good to talk to your parents

about it and let them prayerfully talk to your brother. They will most likely have some good ideas on how to proceed.
